Notes

1. The estimates of earnings for 2001-2007 are based on the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS).
2. Census Bureau midyear population estimates. Estimates for 2001-2007 reflect county population estimates available as of April 2009.
3. Contributions for government social insurance are included in earnings by type and industry but they are excluded from personal income.
4. The adjustment for residence is the net inflow of the earnings of interarea commuters. For the United States, it consists of adjustments for border workers: wage and salary disbursements to US residents commuting to Canada less wage and salary disbursements to Canadian and Mexican residents commuting into the United States.
5. Rental income of persons includes the capital consumption adjustment.
6. Proprietors' income includes the inventory valuation and capital consumption adjustment.
7. "Other" consists of the wages and salaries of U.S. residents employed by international organizations and foreign embassies and consulates in the United States.
8. \* All state and local area dollar estimates are in current dollars (not adjusted for inflation).

9. (D) Not shown to avoid disclosure of confidential information. (L) Less than \$50,000, estimates are included in totals. (N) Data not available for this year.
