Welcome aboard Washington State Ferries! To ensure your trip is a safe and enjoyable one, please take a moment to read the following guidelines:

What's New?
Winter 2015 Sailing Schedule (December 28, 2014 through March 21, 2015) contains these changes from the prior sailing schedule:

- Anacortes/San Juan Islands**
 Four vessels in service on weekdays, three vessels in service on weekends. Modifications from Winter 2014 for Friday afternoon schedule, with more direct sailings.
- Anacortes/Sidney, BC**
 No service operated to Sidney, BC
- Fauntleroy/Vashon/Southworth**
 Fewer sailings on weekends, with minor revisions from Winter 2014.

Understanding Our Schedule
 Times are in **color** for morning or late night (a.m.) departures, and in **black** for afternoon/evening (p.m.) departures. Times listed in the schedule are departure times unless otherwise noted. The schedule is presented as a sailing day which begins with the first printed sailing time for that day and progresses consecutively through the last printed sailing time even though that last

sailing may be past midnight and technically on the following day. Please pay special attention to annotations next to a sailing time. Also, we welcome your feedback. Please send your comments on schedule design to: wsf-schedule@wsdot.wa.gov

Holiday Schedules
 Weekend schedules are in effect on New Year's Day, Thursday, January 1, for the Point Defiance/Tahlequah, Seattle Bainbridge Island, and Mukilteo/Clinton routes. Regular weekday service will be operated on both *Martin Luther King, Jr. Day*, Monday, January 19 and *Presidents Day*, Monday, February 16. Extra service may be provided for holiday or special event traffic on any of our routes. Please watch for notices on the vessels or at the terminals or contact us via the information on the back panel of this brochure at the numbers listed.

Loading
 Vehicles should be in line at least 20 minutes prior to scheduled departure time and are loaded in order of arrival with a few exceptions. On some routes, vehicles must be moved often while in line. Washington State Ferries is part of the State Highway System. Using a cell phone while driving on or off the ferry is prohibited by

law. WSF is a participant in the WSDOT HERO program. Linecutters into ferry queues may be reported at 877-764-HERO (4376).
 Vessels may cease loading two minutes in advance of sailing, except where noted. Walk-on passengers should be on board five minutes prior to scheduled departure time. Security requirements dictate that once loading has begun, the Captain's permission is required to disembark the vessel. Unaccompanied vehicles (without drivers) are not permitted. Please monitor your vehicle.

Truck
 Vehicles that are over 7'6" in height or over 22' in length, including those with tall antennas, may be loaded out of sequence and must pay a surcharge. Vehicles without 12 inches of clearance from the ground may not be loaded.

Bicycle
 Bicyclists and persons carrying kayaks or canoes should wait near the front of the loading area, since they normally load first. Crews will direct passengers on placement of kayaks and canoes. Once on board, secure bikes in the location provided. When leaving the vessel, please watch for and stay out of the way of vehicles. Shoes with metal sports cleats are not permitted in passenger areas. **Note:** Bicycles on roof racks may count as tall vehicles and be subject to a surcharge.

Hand
 Only service animals are allowed in terminal buildings or interior cabin spaces on vessels, except for pets in a pet container. However, pets are permitted on the exposed upper decks of vessels on some routes. Ask terminal staff for loading procedures, as vessels and terminals vary. Animals that are not people-friendly should be muzzled or transported in a pet carrier.

Fares
 Passenger fares are round trip, with the exception of the Port Townsend/Coupeville route and sailings to/from Sidney, BC. Please refer to the *Passenger and Vehicle Fares* brochure or contact us via the information on the rear cover of this schedule. You can pre-purchase your ferry ticket by going to our website. Cash, travelers checks and major credit cards are accepted as payment at the tollbooth. A receipt will be issued for all sales. If a receipt is not issued, or if there is a discrepancy, please call 206-515-3460, or send a description to the address on the back cover of this schedule, *Attention: Operations Revenue Control*. We offer seniors, persons with disabilities and passengers with a Medicare card or other eligibility verification travel at half the regular passenger fare. We also offer special rates for

youth 6 through 18 years of age. Children 5 and under travel for free.
Safety & Security
 Hazardous materials are not allowed aboard a state ferry on scheduled passenger trips except those in compliance with Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations. Prohibited items include, but are not limited to: explosive or incendiary devices, chemical, biological, radiological agents or devices, unlawful or illegally-possessed firearms, and illegal fireworks. Gasoline may be transported in a vehicle in limited quantities up to 12 gallons total in portable containers, not to exceed six gallons maximum per container. Containers must be UL approved and in good condition. All vehicles must have gas caps. Regulations require that you shut off and tag all propane tanks prior to boarding, unless they are the primary fuel source for your vehicle. A limited number of portable propane tanks may be carried in a vehicle in addition to those installed in recreational vehicles. The total amount of propane shall not exceed 100 pounds (water-weight equivalent) whether in a single 100-pound tank or multiple smaller tanks. All propane tanks must be secured and transported in a vehicle. Transporting a combination of gasoline containers and propane tanks is very restricted.

Please turn off your vehicle in the holding lanes. Vehicle emissions can be harmful to the environment as well as to other customers. Vehicle engines must be turned off while the vessel is underway. Do not restart your car until directed by a crew member.
No Smoking
 Smoking is not allowed on WSF vessels. All smoking materials must be extinguished before boarding the vessel. No smoking is allowed within 25 feet of the entry to ferry terminal buildings. Security regulations require that all passengers and vehicles are subject to possible security screening.
Americans With Disabilities Act
 For medical preferential loading information, contact us via the information on the back panel of this brochure. Most terminals are accessible and all regularly-scheduled vessels are elevator-equipped. Check our website or contact us via the back cover of this schedule for current vessel elevator status. **Please let us know at the tollbooth if you need elevator access to allow us to load your vehicle appropriately.** This schedule may be obtained in alternate forms by calling 206-515-3460.

Travel With a Reservation

Make a vehicle reservation by visiting wsdot.wa.gov/ferries/reservations or calling 1-888-808-7977.

Your reservation is not your fare. You may buy a ticket online, pay at the tollbooth, or use multi-ride media at the tollbooth. Missed reservations may be redeemed for standby travel on another same-day sailing from the same terminal. Customers may change or cancel their reservation up to 5 p.m. prior to the day of travel. A no-show fee will be charged for missed reservations not redeemed on the same day from the same terminal.

Best Times to Travel

Visitors, vacationers and commuters can avoid the busiest times and skip long lines by using our Best Times to Travel tool located on our online sailing schedule website. When you select the current schedule you'll see route and day specific tables showing which sailings are generally busiest.

In general, the busiest travel times are Thursday and Friday evenings westbound, and Sunday afternoons eastbound.

Know Before You Go Somewhere

Before driving to the terminal, check the "Terminal Conditions" section of our website for real time vehicle load status and detailed terminal specific information.

Anacortes / San Juan Islands

General Notes

Vehicles, bicycles and kayaks must be ticketed and in line at least 20 minutes prior to printed sailing time or they may not be loaded. Vessel loading will stop two minutes prior to departure time.

Vehicle space on eastbound ferries is apportioned to each island, so ferries making additional island stops may depart with empty space.

- Red Shade: Interisland traffic only
- Fri Fridays only
- ⤴ Time is Arrival time

Westbound Notes

- * Priority for Friday Harbor vehicles ticketed and in line no later than 8:00 p.m.
- ❖ Lopez vehicle traffic may be limited Monday through Thursday. Recommend 5:20 p.m. Lopez-only sailing as an alternative.
- ▼ No vehicles from Anacortes destined for Orcas will be loaded; foot passengers permitted.
- ▲ A limited number of vehicles from Anacortes destined for Lopez and no vehicles from Anacortes destined for Orcas will be loaded; foot passengers permitted.
- Loads or unloads westbound traffic on eastbound sailing.

Eastbound Notes

- ▼ No interisland vehicles loaded; foot passengers permitted.
- ▲ Interisland vehicles only, no Anacortes-bound vehicles loaded; foot passengers permitted.
- Loads or unloads eastbound traffic on westbound sailing.

Reservations Now Available!

New for winter 2015, vehicle reservations are available:

- Westbound: Anacortes to Friday Harbor, Orcas, Lopez and Shaw islands
- Eastbound: Friday Harbor and Orcas islands to Anacortes*

*Reservations are not available for interisland travel, or eastbound travel from Lopez or Shaw islands to Anacortes.

Reservations are also available for travel on Port Townsend / Coupeville.

Please note: Where available, reservations are highly recommended. Reservations must be made at least 3 hours in advance for Anacortes/San Juan Islands. All vehicles with reservations should arrive at least 30 minutes in advance of sailing time to assure your reservation.
