The use of a deluge system is very antiquated with the advent of the new excess flow and internal closing devices that Inter Island Propane is proposing to use in their install. Water on a leak of any size just results in forming a huge ball of ice that inhibits the quick fix of any leak and floods the area. Water was used in the past to allow a person to slip in and manually turn off a hand valve, however that method is not used anymore with newer tank failsafe designs.

I understand that Inter-Island Propane will use and should be required to use the latest in human error failsafe internals and excess flow valves as outlined by Meter...the company doing the install.

Also, I have attached a few photos of a tank site in Port Townsend in light industrial next to houses, a church, a storage site and a fitness club. This site has no deluge system and is typical of the locations we deliver to.

Also is a picture of the quality trucks we use to fill them.
