After reviewing the Water Resources Preliminary Draft ([http://www.sanjuanco.com/DocumentCenter/View/14904/2018-04-20\\_Water-Element-Preliminary\\_draft](http://www.sanjuanco.com/DocumentCenter/View/14904/2018-04-20_Water-Element-Preliminary_draft)), I noticed an error on pages 4-5 that states "

With ground and surface water resources dependent solely on precipitation to recharge,

increasing periods of extended drought will require planning to ensure that adequate water supplies are available"

There are several springs which also operate year around in the islands.

Last August, following a record breaking number of days with no rain, I headed up Mount Constitution and found Cold Springs still running. The temperature of the water was way lower than the temperature from the tepid Summit Lake, indicating why it is called "Cold Springs."

Therefore, the above Water Resources Preliminary statement on page 4-5 is inaccurate and should not be used for planning water for the future of San Juan County.
