Subject: Bulk Fuel Storage

Hello, I am out of town and I was concerned about whether I had commented on the bulk Fuel Definition.

As Bulk Fuel, I feel strongly in accordance with other regulatory environments should be reclassified into appropriate categories falling under their Hazardous ratings buy other entities. The Building Codes The HUD protection distances the quantity classifications that divide Bulk Fuel from Tank Farms. For example a 30,000 gallon propane Tank as a High Hazard Storage component is classed by the Building code as High Hazard, and by petroleum industry standards A tank farm. This is certainly not properly classed in the same definition as a 2000 gallon Bulk fuel tank for retail supply. Currently their are no divisions, and currently we allow Tank farms in light industrial zones I believe completely inappropriately.

I am asking simply that we make provisions that correct this situation for both safety reasons, and for the reasonable protection of the lesser hazardous bulk fuel occupants that could be reasonably located in Light industrial areas.
