

RIGHT OF WAY PERMIT CONDITIONS

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VERIFICATION OF RIGHT OF WAY

- This permit covers only the work and installations within the County road right-of-way.
- Applicant/Owner is responsible for verifying the location of the County right-of-way in relation to the planned work and obtaining permits for work or installations outside of the right-of-way.

APPROVED CONTRACTOR

- Work under this permit must be performed by a Public Works Approved Contractor.
- Approved contractors are licensed in the State of Washington and meet certain insurance and bond requirements.

- Contractor verification is required, prior to construction. (see notification requirements)

CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS

- All permits will be issued with applicable construction standards and/or sight-specific requirements. Variance from these requires written approval.
- Work not complying with these standards may be rejected, and remedial work required.

REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS

- Prior to construction
 - Contractor Selection
 - Construction Notice – 48 hours in advance of starting work
- Completion of Work
 - Inspection Request

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG!

- State law requires you call for utility locates at least two business days before you dig. (Dial 811)

COPY OF PERMIT AT WORK SITE:

- The contractor shall keep a complete copy of the permit (including approved construction plans) onsite at all times work is being performed.

HOURS OF WORK:

- All work shall be performed between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.

TRAFFIC CONTROL:

- Work zone safety is the applicant's responsibility.
- All necessary traffic control will be provided in accordance with State law & the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

CONSTRUCTION STAGING:

- Staging of equipment or materials within the County road right-of-way requires WRITTEN APPROVAL of County Engineer.

STORM WATER BMP'S:

- Erosion prevention measures and Best Management Practices (BMP's) for storm water runoff, shall be employed at all times.

ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES:

- Work shall cease and Public Works shall be notified if archaeological objects are encountered.

SURVEY MONUMENTS:

- The contractor shall take care not to disturb existing monuments. Any land boundary survey monuments that are removed or destroyed shall be replaced at the contractors expense (332-120 WAC).

REVOCAION

The County Engineer may revoke, annul or terminate this permit if:

- the permittee fails to comply with the provisions, requirements or regulations, herein;
- the permittee, through willful or unreasonable neglect, fails to heed or comply with notices given them; or
- the permitted work is not installed, operated and/or maintained in conformity with said provisions, requirements and regulations.
