



SAFE SERVICES and SUPPORTS

SAFE San Juans is a community-based nonprofit agency serving San Juan County residents and visitors who have experienced domestic violence or sexual assault/abuse.

We provide the following free and confidential services:

- **Crisis Intervention** - to support and connect you with information and referrals anytime on our 24-hour crisis lines or in person during office hours.
- **Safety Planning** - to assist you in creating a personalized safety plan for yourself and the loved ones in your life.
- **Advocacy** - where we listen, assist with arranging services, connect you to available resources, and provide you with a safe space to process what you are going through.
- **Legal Advocacy** - to assist you with filing for a protection order and preparing for court appearances. We will also provide advocacy and support for you at court appearances.
- **Medical Advocacy** - to include support for you at the hospital or medical appointments. Our free reproductive health services include condoms, pregnancy tests and emergency Plan B.
- **Support Groups** - including online and in-person educational and support groups that are led by our therapists, educators, and advocates.
- **Professional Mental Health Counseling/Therapy**: Our Masters-level professional counselors can help you with the lingering psychological and emotional effects of domestic or sexual violence.
- **Secondary Services** to offer support and advocacy for your friends and family members who are impacted by the domestic violence or sexual assault/abuse you experienced.

SAFE San Juans' free services are available to anyone without bias towards gender, race, creed, color, culture, language, sexual orientation, religion, national origin, citizenship, age, ethnicity, pregnancy, income, veteran status, marital status, or any mental or physical disability.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE is the physical harm, bodily injury, assault, or the infliction of fear of imminent physical harm, bodily injury or assault, sexual assault, or stalking of one intimate partner by another intimate partner; or of one family or household member by another family or household member.

SEXUAL ASSAULT occurs when a person is forced, coerced, or manipulated into any unwanted sexual activity. It is not your fault if someone does this to you.

San Juans also offers free age-appropriate & research-based Prevention Education to County schools, teaching violence prevention, respect, consent, boundaries & healthy relationships
