PHASE ONE OF FISHERMAN BAY ROAD SHOULDER WIDENING IS NEARING COMPLETION

San Juan County received funding for 'Complete Streets' projects to promote transportation corridors that are safe and convenient for pedestrians and bicyclists. The road shoulder on the west side of Fisherman Bay Road, between Hummel Lake Road and Islands Marine Center, is being widened to 6 feet to improve walking and biking.

The first phase is currently in progress (as shown on the right) along two parcels located across from the solid waste facility (aka the dump). The wider shoulder will have a more gentle cross slope to make it easier for walking.

The second phase is scheduled to commence in late summer/early fall.

The County will be reaching out to adjacent property owners as additional right-of-way may be required in some areas to maintain a uniform 6-foot shoulder or to provide space temporarily for the trail construction. Overhead utilities will be placed underground. Both phases will be gravel surfaced until the County chipseals roads on Lopez Island in the spring of 2021.



This project will provide a wider travel corridor between Lopez Village and the marina for residents and visitors.
