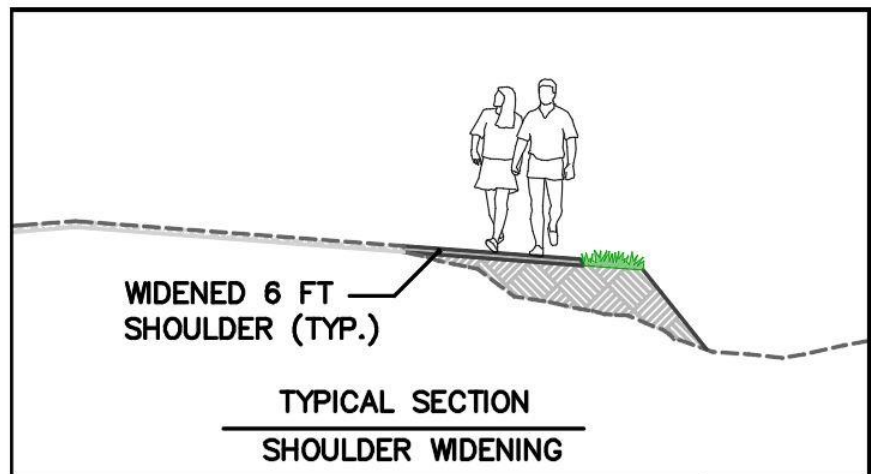

NEXT PHASE OF TRAIL PROJECT TO COMMENCE

Since mid-2020, Public Works has been working to acquire the right-of-way needed to build this trail project. That phase is now complete. Thank you to those property owners that worked with the county for the acquisition of easements that will allow us to continue with this trail project.

The county surveyor will be out in early April to stake the project right-of-way.



Public Works will begin the trail construction in mid-April. Work will take place intermittently throughout the spring and summer.

The widened shoulder will remain graveled (similar to the section across from the solid waste facility) until the utility work to remove the telephone poles is completed. The line will be placed underground and necessary repairs to the shoulder will be made.

Public Works expects to be able to chipseal the widened road shoulder next spring.
