

General Information

Welcome aboard Washington State Ferries. To ensure your trip is a safe and enjoyable one, please take a moment to read the following guidelines.

Understanding Our Schedule

Times in **color** are for morning (a.m.) departures and in black for afternoon/evening departures. Noon is noted as **12:00 a.m.** and one minute past noon as 12:01 p.m. Midnight is noted as 12:00 p.m. and one minute past midnight as **12:01 a.m.** The schedule is presented as a sailing day which begins with the first printed sailing time for that day and progresses consecutively through the last printed sailing time even though the last sailing may be past midnight and technically on the following day. Please pay special attention to annotations next to a sailing time.

Weekend or Holiday Schedules

The holiday schedule is in effect on May 31 for Point Defiance/Tahlequah, Seattle/Bainbridge Island, and Mukilteo/Clinton. Extra service may be provided for special event traffic on any of the routes. Please

watch for notices on the vessels, at the terminals, or call one of the information numbers.

Security

Security regulations require that all passengers and vehicles are subject to possible security screening. Additional security measures appear in the **Safety** and **Loading** sections.

Safety

Hazardous materials are not allowed aboard a state ferry on scheduled passenger trips except those in compliance with Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations. Prohibited items include, but are not limited to, explosive or incendiary devices, chemical, biological, radiological agents or devices, unlawful or illegally possessed firearms, and illegal fireworks.

Gasoline may be transported in a vehicle in quantities of up to 12 gallons total in portable containers, not to exceed 6 gallons maximum per container. Containers must be UL approved and in good condition. All vehicles must have gas caps.

Regulations require that you shut off and tag all propane tanks prior to boarding, unless they are the primary fuel source for your vehicle. A limited number of portable propane tanks may be carried in a vehicle in addition to those installed in recreational vehicles. The total amount of propane shall not exceed 100 pounds (water equivalent) whether in a single 100-pound tank or multiple smaller tanks. All propane tanks must be secured and transported in a vehicle.

Transporting a combination of gasoline containers and propane tanks is highly restricted. Please contact WSF Customer Service for detailed information.

Please turn off your vehicle in the holding lanes. Vehicle emissions can be harmful to the environment as well as to other customers. Vehicle engines must be turned off while the vessel is underway. Do not restart your car until directed by a crew member.

Smoking is not allowed on WSF vessels. All smoking materials must be

extinguished before boarding the vessel. No smoking is allowed within 25 feet of the entry to our ferry terminal facilities.

Loading

Unaccompanied vehicles (vehicles without drivers) are not permitted.

Times listed in the schedule are departure times, unless otherwise noted. Vessels may cease loading two minutes in advance of sailing, except where noted. Walk-on passengers should be on board five minutes prior to departure time.

Vehicles are loaded in order of arrival with a few exceptions; however, vehicles that are over 7'6" tall or over 20' long, including those with tall antennas, may be loaded out of sequence and must pay a surcharge. Vehicles without 12 inches of clearance from the ground may not be loaded during extreme tidal conditions. Security requirements dictate that once loading has begun, the Captain's permission is required to disembark the vessel.

Vehicles should be in line at least 20 minutes prior to scheduled departure time. On some routes, vehicles must be moved frequently while in line. Please monitor your vehicle.

Bicyclists and persons carrying kayaks or canoes should wait near the front of the loading area, since they normally load first. Once on board, secure bikes in the place provided. Crews will direct passengers on placement of kayaks and canoes. When leaving the vessel, please watch for, and stay out of the way of, vehicles. Shoes with metal sports cleats are not permitted in passenger areas.

Animals, except service animals, are not allowed in terminal buildings or above the car decks, unless they are in a pet container; however, they are permitted on the exposed upper decks of vessels on some routes. Contact terminal staff for loading procedures as vessel and terminal configurations vary. Animals that are not people-friendly should be muzzled or transported in a pet carrier.

Fares

Passenger fares are generally round trip with the exception of the Port Townsend/Keystone route and all International sailings to Sidney, British Columbia. We offer seniors, persons with disabilities and passengers with a Medicare card, or other eligibility verification travel at half the regular passenger fare. We offer special rates for youth 6-18 years of age. Children 5 and under travel free. Not all terminals and vessels are ♿ accessible.



Special Travel Notes: Anacortes / Sidney, BC Route

Travel from the San Juans: Vehicle space on the ferries is allocated for each island. Ferries may depart with empty space to accommodate vehicles at other stops.

International Reservations: Vehicle reservations are *recommended* for travel to or from Sidney, BC and must be made at least 24 hours in advance by calling 206-464-6400 or 888-808-7977 (WA & BC) or at www.wsdot.wa.gov/ferries.

International Travel: Travelers 16 years of age and older who enter the U.S. at land and sea ports of entry are required to present a valid Passport. For U.S. and Canadian Citizens only, Passport Cards and trusted traveler program cards—NEXUS, SENTRI and FAST—will continue to be accepted for cross-border travel. Or, for U.S. citizens who are also Washington State residents, the Enhanced Driver's License (EDL) will meet the requirements for proof of citizenship to re-enter the U.S. from Canada by land or sea.

U.S. and Canadian citizens who are 15 years old or younger will still be allowed to travel with just a copy of their birth

certificate, as will teens between the ages of 16-18 if they are part of an adult supervised school, religious, cultural or athletic group.

If both birth parents are not traveling with children, you must have notarized written authorization from the parent(s) along with a telephone number where they can be reached to verify the authorization or proof of custody. Failure to provide such evidence may make you inadmissible to Canada.

Note: Individuals with felony or DUI convictions are routinely denied entry into Canada. Also, Canadian law prohibits individuals from bringing guns, mace, pepper spray and other personal defense products into Canada.

Vehicles and baggage are subject to inspection. Articles you bring into either country are subject to being taxed.
